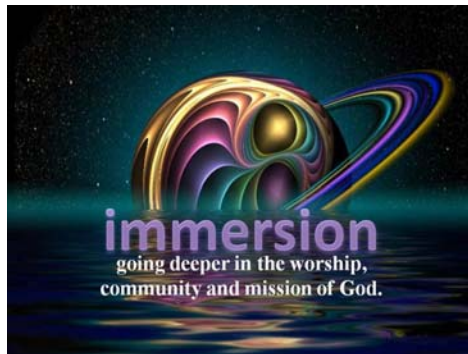

The final chapter in the "written" Book of Acts (I say written because the Book of Acts continues to unfold today only we are the people on the ground as opposed to the early Disciples) follows the storm at sea and ends with Paul in prison in Rome. It is interesting that when the storm-beaten passengers on the ship finally landed on shore they were welcomed by the islanders and more importantly they landed alive and whole! What would it have been like had the sailors had their way during the panic and abandoned ship with the others on board, or had the soldiers had their way and killed all the prisoners including Paul to save their own skins? Both groups may have survived yet having to live the rest of their lives with the consequences of their actions. It is also interesting that Paul, in spite of the trauma immediately picked up with ministry work on the island no doubt bringing many of the inhabitants closer to God as a result. There can be times after a storm we need "safe harbor" for a time to recover but that doesn't mean we stay there. Our ministry is back on track as soon as we are back on our feet. Our ministry never stops; it is 24/7. That is what we do. We are living the Book of Acts!

We now begin a study of the Book of Joshua. Have you ever wondered about the Conquest and the Ethical Question of War in God's Kingdom? Come join us as we explore this over the next few months.

We meet in the Chapel immediately following the 1st service. We will be welcomed by the members of the class just liked the islanders welcomed the shipwreck survivors.

Food Pantry

A note from Marirose . . . *"I wanted to take this time to thank all who have made donations to our food pantry. Through these donations, we continue to help meet the needs of those attending our community meal, as well as those who come to us in need throughout the month. The shelves in the pantry are beginning to empty due to the growing needs in our community. Helping to keep our pantry well-stocked is a church family project. We are all called to be servants of Christ, and this is a wonderful way of doing so. Bringing just one can/jar/bottle of a non-perishable food or personal care items with us each time we come to the church is a really easy way for everyone to help. Together, our church can help to curb the hunger in our area. Thanks, Marirose."*

Particular needs this month are canned fruit, side dishes (such as macaroni and cheese, rice, noodles) and canned vegetables. Here is the list of items we need on a regular basis: canned meat (tuna, salmon, beef stew, chili, chicken, Spam; 16-oz. canned fruits and vegetables; boxed rice, potatoes, pasta; hot cereal; hot chocolate; baby items (diapers, wet wipes, etc.); personal care items (shampoo, deodorant, Kleenex, razors, shaving cream, toothpaste and toothbrushes, sanitary products, soap, toilet paper, dish soap, etc.)

On Sunday, August 22 the Missions and Evangelism Committees sponsored a Community Ice Cream Social. Though we would have liked to have seen

more "church folks" there, the turnout from the neighborhood was nice and we all had a great time. We want to thank everyone who helped out with this year's Ice Cream Social and especially all those who donated cookies.



Reaching Out to Ghana

We are happy to announce that the first shipment of supplies to Bonwire Wesley Methodist Church in Ghana was sent out on Monday, August 16. With school soon starting in Ghana, we decided that the school supplies should be sent out first so that the children would have them to use as they begin another school year.

We are thankful for donations from individuals that helped with the cost of shipping. Thanks to our congregation, the following items were sent in three boxes via US Post Office: 20 school boxes, 2 pencil boxes, 8 bottles of white glue, 6 glue sticks, 34 boxes of crayons, 13 rulers, 6 boxes of markers, 4 packs of colored pencils, 17 pens, 2 permanent markers, 64 pairs of kids' scissors, 692 pencils, 64 erasers, 4 pencil grippers, and 114 small pencil sharpeners. Pastor Val has notified the pastor of Bonwire Church that these items are on their way. Once we know that they get to their destination, we will plan on shipping more items over. We would like to thank all who contributed. We will be keeping everyone updated as to the future needs of the children of Bonwire Wesley Methodist Church.

Basketball Hall of Fame member, Jerry Lucas, will be coming to our church to share his Christ-led ministry on Sunday, September 26 and Monday, September 27.

You may remember Jerry Lucas as a former Middletown High School and Ohio State Basketball player and 1960 Olympic Basketball Gold Medalist, as well as a player in the NBA for eleven years with seven All-Star appearances. He is one of only three players who have won a championship at every level of competition, including a High School State Championship, a College National Championship, an Olympic Gold Medal and a World Professional Championship. In 1996, the NBA's 50th anniversary, he was named one of the 50 greatest players in National Basketball Association history, and in 1999, he was named to Sports Illustrated's five-man college All-Century Team.

Jerry is also known as "Dr. Memory" and will be sharing his world-renown learning system with us as part of his "Weekend to Remember" series. His ministry focuses on family relationships, family

learning and remembering names and faces. Jerry Lucas brings incredible energy and passion with these messages. This ministry promises to provide memories for all who join us. 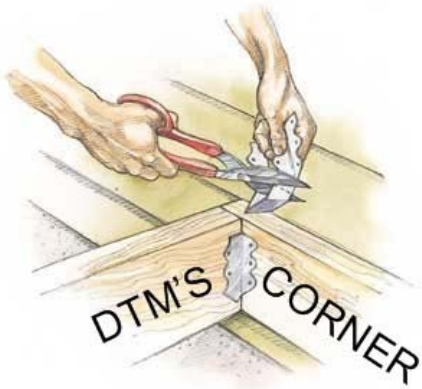

Dear Church Family,

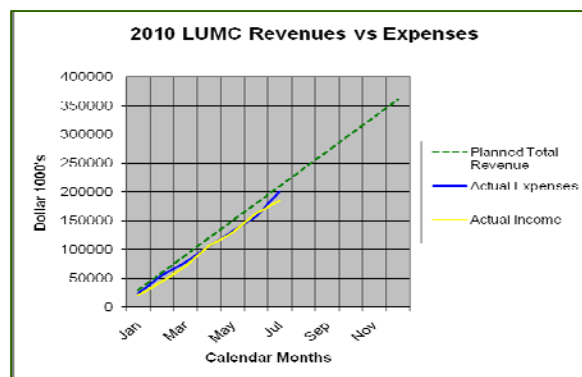
I wanted to share a few things with you about the finances here at LUMC. We continue to fight our way thru the year. As you have probably seen, our expenses have outpaced our income slightly.

We were able to use monies from the sale of the house on Freeman Avenue to do the major repairs to the piping under Fellowship Hall. Our department leaders have also done a great job at controlling expenses this year. As you can see by the graph below we have had more expenses than income, but have kept expenses well below what we budgeted.

I would also like to remind everyone that our Miracle Sunday campaign continues to make efforts to improve our church. We have been able to use money from the campaign to upgrade the technology that the church uses in the way of

sound, lighting, and computers. We are also using Miracle Sunday money to promote and design the new Immersion service to begin September 1.
